St. Thomas More Cathedral School Arlington, VA

St. Thomas More (STM) Cathedral School continues to provide and expand inclusive education in accordance with the policies promoted by Most Reverend Michael F. Burbidge, Bishop of Arlington.

For more than 15 years, St. Thomas More Cathedral School has promoted differentiated instruction that meets the needs of varied learners.

Students in Pre-K to 6th are assessed at the start of each school year to determine reading and comprehension skills. Student progress is assessed again at mid-year and in May of each school year. The data from these assessments is used to identify areas of need and strength which are incorporated into instructional plans for small group work. Students who do not meet bench marks are monitored for progress and early intervention can be successfully implemented based on the accumulated documentation.

This standard operating procedure became the springboard for establishing a full scale inclusion program in the 2019-2020 school year.


We Need You!
