Dear Friends of Porto Charities,

It's that time of year again when thoughts drift off to the upcoming holidays and the weather starts cooling off. But, here at Porto Charities, things are just starting to heat up. Here's the update:

- A great time was had by all at our **13th Annual Charity Golf Tournament** held on Friday, October 8th at the Regency at Dominion Valley Golf Club in Haymarket, VA. More than 70 golfers showed up to enjoy the day's friendly competition and fairly nice weather. More than \$20,000 was raised to support our efforts. Thanks to ALL of you who participated, donated or sponsored the day's activities. A standout performance that day was provided by our special guest speaker, Ms. Elizabeth Eisenberg, who addressed our crowd during lunch and whose remarks earned the first standing ovation in the Tournament's history!
- **Porto's' Parents' Advisory Council** continues to meet and work on their first-year plans. Several priorities on their list include: developing the Porto Ambassadors Program (outreach to ALL parishes in the Diocese); a new podcast/webinar series and representing Porto Charities at an upcoming Office of Faith Formation conference for Religious Ed teachers. Details on all their efforts will be forthcoming.
- The **2022-2023 Call for Funding Proposals** went out to schools in the Diocese several weeks ago. Grant requests must be received by my office by **November 30th** at which time the Porto Board of Directors' Grant Review Committee begins their work.
- We are pleased to announce that Porto Charities is working with the Office of Catholic Education and the Office of Faith Formation to develop the Catholic Diocese of Arlington's first-ever **diocesan-wide inclusive education conference** to support the needs of students with intellectual and developmental disabilities, their families, educators, and clergy. Entitled "**From Inclusion to Belonging – Embracing Disability in the Body of Christ**", the event is designed to inform, inspire, and equip Catholics in schools and parishes to create a culture of belonging for individuals with, or impacted by, disability. It is scheduled for **Saturday, February 5, 2022, from 8:30 am – 1:30 pm at Bishop O'Connell High School in Arlington**. More details to be announced shortly.
- We are excited to announce that Porto's third annual **Mystery in Marrakesh** event is back and scheduled to be held at the **Springfield Golf and Country Club on Sunday, February 27, 2022 at 5:30 pm**. Most recently, Sharon worked with the local diocesan school, All Saints, to admit Lulu as their first ever child with Down syndrome for the 2021 school year. Sharon continues to serve on the PTO at All Saints and is excited to see inclusive education grow within the diocese!

Steven Storey is a Customer Success Executive and has worked for some of the largest and most successful financial and technology companies in the world. Currently he is a Sr. Customer Success Manager with Microsoft Corporation.
