The Basilica School of St. Mary
Alexandria, VA

In addition to providing more than 200 students a year with intervention services, extra instruction, and accommodations designed for students with learning disabilities as part of the Basilica School's Learning Resources Center, Basilica School of Saint Mary has also created a program of instruction and faculty support for our special education students.

We employ a full inclusion model that places all students within the general education classroom while also addressing appropriately the individual learning needs of each student — from simply providing more time for a child to take a test or accomplish a task, to modifying curriculum and providing supplemental small group instruction to meet the needs of students with intellectual disabilities, autism or significant cognitive delays.

St. Thomas Aquinas Regional School

At Aquinas we believe that all human beings are created in the image of Christ. We embrace the opportunity for students to grow socially, spiritually, and academically alongside their peers in a Catholic environment and strive to promote belongingness. Aquinas recognizes the beauty and potential inherent within each student.

Aquinas currently offers a resource program to assist students with individualized and specific educational support needs. It is the school's goal to expand that program to offer support to students with more significant needs. For the first time, Aquinas has accepted and is serving a student in this current school year with Downs Syndrome. With this year as a pilot, the future goal would be to expand the program and accept additional students with intellectual disabilities.

Inclusion Conference Draws More than 250 Attendees



From Inclusion to Belonging

EMBRACING DISABILITY AS
PART OF THE CHURCH



Our 1st Inclusion conference was a success! Held Saturday, Feb 5, 2022, the conference was sponsored by the diocesan Office of Catholic Schools, Office of Faith Formation, Bishop O'Connell High School and Porto Charities.

Bishop Michael F. Burbidge said in opening remarks that his goal is to expand services for

students with intellectual disabilities to every school in the diocese. Currently, 12 elementary and all four diocesan high schools have students with intellectual disabilities such as Down syndrome. Bishop Burbidge also spoke about the Diocese's work with Porto Charities to help students with intellectual disabilities find jobs after they graduate, and he hopes to create such jobs at the chancery building. "Our chancery should lead by example," he said.

The featured speaker was Beth Foraker, Founder of the National Catholic Board on Full Inclusion. "Belonging is delight, joy and laughter. That is the level up from just inclusion," said Foraker, who encouraged diocesan parents, educators and advocates during the inspiring conference.

After Foraker's presentation, a panel responded to questions from attendees. On the panel were Diane Elliott, Assistant Superintendent for Student Support Services; Susan Rinaldi, Director of Expanded Services at Bishop O'Connell; Nancy Emanuel, Diocesan Coordinator for Special Needs Ministries in the Office of Faith Formation; Larry Rzepka, Executive Director of Porto Charities; and Carmen Chiappetta, Outreach Coordinator for Porto Charities and school teacher. Elliott said 269 parents and others from across the diocese registered for the conference. "We're not just talking the talk, we want to walk the walk together with you," she said, adding that an in-person gathering is planned Nov. 5.

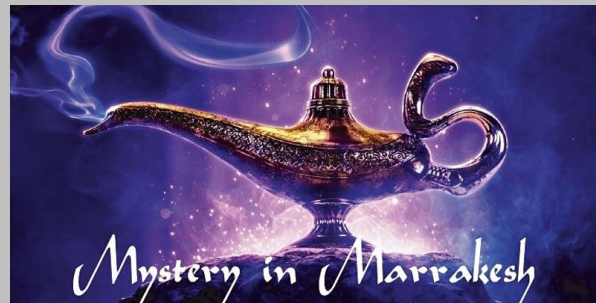

Our friends at the **Optimist Club of Greater Vienna** are offering a \$2,500 scholarship to assist students with documented Intellectual Disabilities (ID) from the greater Vienna area with certificates of completion to continue their education in post-secondary educational/training programs.

There is one award per year. The scholarship award will be in the form of a check payable to the educational/training institution that the applicant will attend. The student may use an award at any time from the date of award, until and including the fall semester or quarter of the calendar year following the announcement of the award.
