Porto Charities Invited to Participate at National Convening



Over 90 inclusion advocates and experts from around the country gathered at the newly established Herrmann Center for Innovative Catholic Education at St. Louis University.

Porto Charities was proud to be invited to be a part of this group that included representatives from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), the National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA), the National Catholic Partnership on Disability (NCPD), the FIRE Foundation, ONE Classroom, as well as experts from higher education, diocesan school offices, and dedicated principals and teachers at inclusive Catholic schools.

Our very own Carmen Chiappetta represented Porto Charities at this convening, and this is what she had to say about the experience: "It was truly humbling to see the great work being done by our colleagues in other states and to have the opportunity to share what we have learned in the Diocese of Arlington. Through a series of guided conversations, the group came together to create a shared vision and a national agenda for the inclusion of students with disabilities in our Catholic schools that will address challenges and priorities at

Bishop Burbidge has opened a feasibility study for the possible creation of a **Diocesan Vocational Technical School**. If implemented, this program will integrate Catholic values with career, technical, and vocational training, preparing students for meaningful careers while deepening their faith. Students will gain hands-on experience while fostering a Christ-centered approach to their vocation.
